Following a few comments received this week about use of the car park I would like to clarify the situation with relation to traffic and our approach to making the roads around school safer for your children. Firstly, our aim is to reduce traffic and encourage everyone to walk or find a safe way to travel to school. Clearly this is not always possible and some of you, due to work commitments and distance from school, find this difficult. As a consequence of this we have opened our staff car park. However, it would appear some feel that they can use the car park irresponsibly blocking entrances and exits and other cars. We would suggest you park a little further away from school and walk. Remember, the whole purpose of encouraging sensible use of the roads is for the safety of your children. We are very lucky to have a car park so please use it responsibly.
