#### HOLIDAYS DURING TERM TIME

The school supports the view that every lesson counts and discourages parents from taking holidays in term time. However, there may be circumstances when this is unavoidable.

The Head Teacher may authorise holidays in term time if:

- Leave of absence from education forms are received at least 4 weeks prior to the proposed holiday
- The proposed holiday is for no longer than 10 schools days
- The child has not already had 10 days holiday during that academic year.

The Head Teacher will not authorise holidays in term time:

- During Year 2 and Year 6 SATs testing
- Any holiday application for a child with less than 95% for the previous 12 months attendance for whatever reason
- Holiday requested on the last day of term for the first week of the following term will not be authorised (except in exceptional circumstances).


