MARGARET THATCHER

The most famous former pupil of Huntingtower Community Primary School passed away on Monday 8th April, aged 87. She was a student at the "Huntingtower Road Council School" from 1930 to 1936 and then she received a scholarship to attend Kesteven and Grantham Girls' School. As we all know, she went on to be the first ever female Prime Minister and held the position from 1979 until 1990.

people think about her political stance we recognise that she aspired to great things and that, if we put our minds to it, we too can achieve great things.
