<p>Numberblocks BBC iPlayer Series 2: Odds and Evens Focus is on odd and even numbers</p> <p>Day 1- Enjoy watching Numberblocks Series 2: Odds and Evens.</p> <p>Day 2-Watch the same episode again. Pause it at various points to see if children can spot a numberblock with an odd top. Repeat for an even top.</p> <p>Day 3- See If children can make blocks of cubes with odd tops (using any bricks you have at home e.g lego, duplo, megablocks).</p> <p>Day 4- Repeat Day 3 but make even tops.</p> <p>Day 5- Count to ten saying the odd numbers in a quiet voice and the even numbers in a loud voice.</p>	<p>Phonics- Set 1 and set 2 sounds These are on daily.
