<p><a href="#">Numberblocks</a> <a href="#">BBC iPlayer Series 2: The Two Tree</a> The focus is on taking away two and partitioning numbers into 2 and the remaining part.</p> <p><b>Day 1</b> - Enjoy watching Numberblocks series 2: The Two Tree.</p> <p><b>Day 2</b> - Watch the same episode again. Ask the children what they noticed. Which games or sports do you know that have scores? Pause it at various points to see if children can tell you the remaining part of the number when 2 is taken away e.g. 6 is the whole, 4 is a part and 2 is a part.</p> <p><b>Day 3</b> - Can the children use Duplo/Lego to make a number block and then split it/partition it into 2 and the remaining part. E.g. <math>7 = 2</math> and 5, <math>8 = 2</math> and 6. Can they say the sentence "7 is the whole, 2 is a part and 5 is a part but the whole is 7."</p> <p><b>Day 4</b> - Watch 10 fat sausages using the following link: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YNNBHQTfb8k">youtube.com/watch?v=YNNBHQTfb8k</a> Can you sing along? Can you work out how many will be left each time?</p>	<p><a href="#">Phonics- Set 1 and set 2 sounds</a> These are on daily. Please remember to practise writing each sound.</p> <p><a href="#">Reading- RWI books</a></p> <p>Listen to the online story of The Three Little Pigs. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QLR2pLUsl-Y">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QLR2pLUsl-Y</a></p> <p>Talk about your favourite part of the story. Why do you like that part? Who is your favourite character? Can you say some of the phrases from the story using the voice of the character?</p> <p>Draw a picture of one of the pigs and write a sentence to describe him. What does he look like and how does he feel. An idea could be: He is pink and sad.</p>	<p>What did the 3 Little Pigs use to make their houses? Which house was the best and why?</p> <p>Have a think, what happens if you blow straw, sticks and bricks. If you have any of these at home you could test what happens by blowing each of them.</p> <p>What happens if it "rains" on them? You could try putting each of the items in a bowl of water to see what happens.
