



<p><a href="#">Numberblocks</a> <a href="#">BBC iPlayer Series 2: Numberblock Castle</a></p> <p>The focus is on combining 2 numbers to make a quantity.</p> <p><b>Day 1</b> - Enjoy watching Numberblocks series 2: Numberblock Castle.</p> <p><b>Day 2</b> - Watch the same episode again. Ask the children what they noticed. Have you been to a castle before? What was it like? What were the problems that numbers 1,2,3 and 4 experienced?</p> <p><b>Day 3</b> - Using Duplo/Lego make the number blocks 1 to 10. Put the blocks in a bag; without looking, pull out two blocks and find the total. Can you say the sentence using the two blocks you pull out, e.g. "4 and 2 together make 6."</p> <p><b>Day 4</b> - Adult to draw a part, part, whole grid on paper or using chalk on your patio. Put objects into the whole section and then partition them into two parts e.g. 5 balls in the whole can be partitioned into 2 and 3 or 1 and 4 or 5 and 0. Use the sentence, "5 is the whole, 2 is a part and 3 is a part and the whole is 5."</p>	<p><a href="#">Phonics- Set 1 and set 2 sounds</a> These are on daily. Please remember to practise writing each sound.</p> <p><a href="#">Reading- RWI books</a></p> <p>Watch the online story of The Three Little Pigs again. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QLR2pLUsl-Y">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QLR2pLUsl-Y</a></p> <p>Can you act out the story to your grown up?</p> <p>Draw a picture and write about your favourite part of the story.</p> <p>This is what I would draw and write:</p>  <p>I like the part when the wolf says I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down!</p>	<p>Thinking about the characters in the story of the Three Little Pigs have a go at making your own using your own choice of materials. If you have paint try mixing 2 colours to make a pink for the pig and then 2 colours for a grey for the wolf. What colours do you need to make the pink and grey? You can use your characters when you are acting out the story.</p> <p>Here are my ideas:</p> 	<p>Have a go at making a feelings chart to complete each day. You might be like to talk about why you are feeling in a certain way to someone at home.</p>

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**Day 5** – Adult to put sets of objects into the part, part sections of your part, part, whole drawing. Can you combine them to find the whole? Say the sentence to show the calculation e.g. 4 is a part and 3 is a part and the whole is 7. To challenge yourself you could write the calculation too e.g.  $4+3 = 7$ .

These activities are a suggestion of how you can spend your week on home schooling. It does not have to be structured this way or attempted all in one go. Please do not worry if you have not managed to complete everything.
