<p>White Rose Maths Home Learning Year 2 Week 7</p> <p>This week focusses on fractions and understanding equal groups and sharing.</p> <p>You could use household objects to solve the problems practically.</p> <p>Year 2 Bitesize Daily Lessons</p>	<p>Phonics- Set 2 and set 3 sounds These are on daily</p> <p>Reading- RWI books</p> <p>Read the poems 'Summer Time' and 'Summer'.</p> <p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Talk about what you think of summer time. Do you like the weather? What does summer time feel like? What do you like to do in the summer time? • Find other poems about summer. Choose your favourite and practise performing it for someone at home. • Create a mind map of your thoughts about summer. Remember to include how summer makes you feel and the activities you could do. • Write your own summer poem. You can choose an acrostic poem like 'Summer' or a list poem like 'Summer Time'. You might like to add illustrations to your poem too. • Read your poem to an audience. You could make a video and post to the class Twitter page. 	<p>History-How were animals used during WWII and how do we use them today?</p> <p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research how pigeons, dogs and horses were used during WWII. • Can you find out about any other animals that were used? • Create a poster showing how animals were used during the war? • Research what jobs animals do today? • Write a list of the animals and what job they do. Can you Illustrate It using drawings or pictures from the Internet? • What do you predict animals might do In the future?
