Practise Common exception words.</p> <p>Read/listen to the story of Esio Trot by Roald Dahl up to and including P12. There is a copy of the story for you to look at if you do not have the book at home.</p> <p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify any vocabulary that you are unsure of and look in a dictionary to find the meaning. • Who are the main characters in the story so far? • What are Mr. Hoppy's two favourite things? • What makes Mr. Hoppy 'absurdly jealous' and why? • Why do you think Mr. Hoppy 'wished more than ever that he could change places with Alfie and become a tortoise'? • What do you think will happen in the next part of the story? • What would you say to Mr. Hoppy to help him be brave enough to talk to Mrs Silver? <p>Quentin Blake is famous for drawing many illustrations to help us imagine characters in books by Roald Dahl. Can you draw the main characters you have met so far? There are three of them. Around each of the characters, use words to describe them. Look in the text up to P12 to help you.</p> <p>SRP: Pick a book on SRP to read and discuss what your child enjoyed about the book. Don't forget to take the quiz!</p> | <p>Priam's Treasure Look at the artefacts in Priam's Treasure Photo Pack, a collection found by archaeologist Heinrich Schliemann in the 1870s. The finds are believed to date back the time of ancient Troy.</p> <p>Look at the pictures. Do you think you know what it is? Do you have any questions about the artefact?</p> <p>What have you learnt about Greek life from the artefacts?</p> | <p>This week it is all about celebrating the special people in our lives. It is Father's Day on Sunday 21st June.</p> <p>Ask your special person what their favourite indoor and outdoor games are. Play both of them this week at some point. Indoors you could play snakes and ladders, a card game, monopoly or scrabble. Outside you could play a ball game or simply go for a walk and a talk together.</p> <p>Create a poster to make your special person the centre of attention. Around a drawing of them, you can list all the things that you love about them. You could even write a special message for them.</p> <p>Build a den together. Again, this could be inside or outside and use whatever you have around as long as you have checked it is ok with your grown up. Once it is finished, share a story inside with someone special.
