Practise <a href="#">Common exception words</a>.</p> <p>Read/listen to chapters 15 and 16 of <a href="#">Charlie and the Chocolate factory</a></p> <p>You could:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify any vocabulary that you are unsure of and look in a dictionary to find the meaning.</li> <li>• What makes a 'never-ending sucking sound' and why?</li> <li>• Why do you think the Oompa-Loompas 'burst into peals of laughter' when they see the children?</li> <li>• Why do you think Roald Dahl chooses to use nonsense words in Chapter 16?</li> <li>• Find 10 outstanding openers in Chapter 15 e.g. 'Graceful?' Use each opener to begin your own sentence. Try to make it about the story, choose your own vocabulary, punctuation and conjunctions. Be ambitious!</li> <li>• Veruca Salt is 'the girl who got everything she wanted.' Imagine you got everything you wanted. Write down 5 positive effects this would have and 5 negative effects. Consider both sides of the argument. Explain whether you would like everything you wanted as soon as you asked for it.</li> </ul> <p>SRP: Pick a book on SRP to read and discuss what your child enjoyed about the book. Don't forget to take the quiz!</p>	<p><a href="#">Priam's Treasure</a></p> <p>Look at the artefacts in Priam's Treasure Photo Pack, a collection found by archaeologist Heinrich Schliemann in the 1870s. The finds are believed to date back the time of ancient Troy.</p> <p>Look at the pictures. Do you think you know what it is? Do you have any questions about the artefact?</p> <p>What have you learnt about Greek life from the artefacts?</p>	<p>This week it is all about celebrating the special people in our lives. It is Father's Day on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> June.</p> <p>Ask your special person what their favourite indoor and outdoor games are. Play both of them this week at some point. Indoors you could play snakes and ladders, a card game, monopoly or scrabble. Outside you could play a ball game or simply go for a walk and a talk together.</p> <p>Create a poster to make your special person the centre of attention. Around a drawing of them, you can list all the things that you love about them. You could even write a special message for them.</p> <p>Build a den together. This could be inside or outside and use whatever you have around as long as you have checked it is ok with your grown up. Once it is finished, share a story inside with someone special. You could each choose your favourite book.</p>
