Welcome back! Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful break over the holidays. The Spring term is always a busy one, with lots of consolidation of learning and new learning taking place. This Spring term will involve Year 5 going swimming and taking part in bikeability.

In **English** and **Maths** this term, we will building on the knowledge we have been learning during the Autumn term. In English, we will focus on developing our understanding of punctuation, vocabulary and sentence structure by writing in a range of genres. In Maths, multiplication and division knowledge will be built upon. Fractions, decimals and percentages are a large part of our curriculum as we move into Spring 2. The children will be applying this knowledge in a range of contexts.

Reading continues to be a key focus in Year 5. Please encourage your child to read frequently at home and quiz on their books on Scholastic Reading Pro (links are available on the academy website). Merits are given for reading at home and books signed by adults.

Spellings are taught for 15 minutes every day in school. We do not send spellings home as homework.
