We will be again focusing on spelling, punctuation and grammar to help with our writing.

Maths will be developing the fluency of both mental and written calculation skills. We will be practising our skills with fractions and decimals. Everyone will continue to learn their multiplication tables and be able to recall these quickly in preparation for the Multiplication Tables Check in June.

Geography: We are discovering our earth and it's physical features; learning about earthquakes and volcanoes.

History: We are learning about the Anglo Saxons and their way of life, discovering what they wore, ate and how they travelled.

Science: We are learning about The digestive system, discovering how our bodies use food and Scientific inquiries.

PE: Each class will take it in turns to go swimming this term. Rhinos in Term 5 and Panthers in Term 6. Additionally, we will be learning how to play Cricket and Rounder's', using our catching and throwing skills but also how to use tactics whilst working as a team.
