It has been another very busy term. Term 4 is one of our favourites as we celebrate reading with World Book Day. It has been more of World Book Month with lots of opportunities to read and take part in challenges and events. On World Book Day, children were able to spend time with children in different classes sharing their favourite books. The staff spent time decorating their doors and the children enjoyed touring the academy building to visit the various doors. There was also a week long class reading challenge which **Tigers and Wombat classes** won. They won the right to be the first visitors to our newly stocked library as well as 10 merits each and the choice of new class book. They were definitely the winners as reading is the secret to success! Thank you to everyone who supported their child with their characters or hearing them read. Our library is now open for children to visit and change their books. Nearly all of the books are new so ask you to support your child in looking after them at home. Unfortunately, one book has already been damaged by a water bottle which was stored in the reading folder.

We have also celebrated World Poetry Day with a choral speaking assembly. We are very glad it wasn't a competition as it would have been too hard to pick a winning year group.

Three year groups have had discos this term - Years 2, 3 and 6. Each disco was well attended and the children reported that they enjoyed the events very much.

The children have been working very hard and earning merits. At the end of each long term, we announce the Merit Totals for each Tower Team. At the end of Term 2, Crane were in first place with 15586 merits. At the end of this term the scores were:




















































































































Sporting Achievements



This has been another very busy term for sporting events. There have been a range of competitions as well as opportunities for children to improve their skills.

Across the term, we have participated in:

- KS2 Swimming Gala group B- pupils in Y3, 4, 5 and 6. We had many children place and came
 first overall as well as placing first in the relay cup. We were delighted for all who took part. This
 is the second year we have been the overall winners.
- Netball Year 5 and 6 pupils took part in a tournament at Priory Ruskin. They enjoyed the experience of playing against other school teams.
- Pupils from Y1 upwards also took part in a Gymnastics competition (on Mother's day too). We
 were one of the biggest school teams and we are incredibly proud of everyone who took part
 and many children and teams placed.
- Year 5 and 6 pupils took part in a Kwik Sticks hockey competition. They were determined to do
 well and represented the academy and they placed 3rd in the tournament.

One of our football team played against Gonerby Hill Foot school. Both sides played well and the
match was a draw. We also took part in a Let Girls Play festival as well as the postponed Girls'

Daily Routines

- Please remember that: the Classroom doors open at **8.50am** in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and in Key Stage 2, staff will collect their classes from the playground.
- The registers open at 8.50am. Please arrive at the academy from 8.40am to ensure your child is ready to enter the academy at 8.50am. Doors and gates and the registers close at 9.00am.
- Any children who arrive after 9.00am through main entrance and are recorded as unauthorised, will require the adult who drops them off to complete a slip. The administration office is extremely busy at this time and this allows the staff to ensure that the correct information is communicated with the class teachers as well as updating the lunch register.

- We understand that the start and end of the academic day can be extremely busy not just on the academy property but also in the immediate community. Please be considerate of others and ensure that you use the allocated areas to park.

If your child is unwell, please let as know as soon as possible. A message can be left on our absence answer machine, a message can be sent via text or email (to our enquiries email address) or you can wait to speak to one of the administrators. We appreciate that the phone lines and the office can be very busy first thing in the mornings but it is important to let us know. If we are able to ascertain why your child is absent, we will have to register them as having an unauthorised absence.

In addition, can we remind you that:

- Children are encouraged to bring a water bottle in the classroom for them to access during the day. This should only be water and not squash.
- Children should come in their PE kits (including their coloured PE top) on the days that they have PE. They should still wear their school jumpers or cardigans and not hooded tops. Tracksuit

bottoms and leggings should be black, dark grey (not light grey) or navy without motifs or visible labels.

• Earrings should be removed for PE days.
