## SCHOOL UNIFORM

As we come to the end of a very busy and successful year, we would just like to take the opportunity to thank you for your continued support with your child's uniform. As you know, it is our school uniform policy that all children should wear their uniform with pride in their appearance and reflecting the school's ethos to REACH.

## Uniform

Parents are asked to support us by sending their child to school in full uniform. We appreciate that you may want to purchase new school uniform during the summer holiday. Can we please remind of the following uniform requirements:-

## School Uniform:

- Pale blue polo shirts (not cotton shirts)
- Either school logo sweatshirt or plain navy 'V' neck jumper or girls cardigan (no hooded wear at all)
- Boys: Trousers grey school trousers (school tailored shorts in the summer)
- Girls: Grey school trousers or grey skirt or pinafore (checked or striped blue dress in the summer)
- Black school shoes (no boots or trainers)
- Navy blue fleece with or without the school logo
- Plain socks (grey for boys and white or grey for girls) - tights (navy/grey)

## PE Uniform:

- White polo/'T' shirt
- Navy blue (black shorts will be fine until they grow out of them)
- Plimsolls (indoor), trainers (outdoor)
- In colder weather children are encouraged to wear a track suit (not applicable to Foundation Stage), but unnecessary during the Summer Term.

No bracelets, apart from attendance bracelets, may be worn in school. Please avoid flowery headbands.

It would be helpful that when you need to buy new uniform these new recommendations are followed, thank you. PLEASE ENSURE THAT <u>ALL</u> UNIFORM IS CLEARLY LABELLED
